## Rescued Pig, Lucy, Finds New Home for a New Year and Maybe Love at Well Known Sanctuary

Napa, CA – Lucy, the rare Red Wattle pig, rescued by Napa Valley non-profit Jameson Animal Rescue Ranch (JARR) after she was abandoned in a field at one-week-old, has found a permanent home with Animal Place sanctuary. JARR will be transporting Lucy to her new home in Grass Valley on Monday, Jan 2nd and will be setting off from Stanly Lane Pumpkin Patch.

Last September, JARR received a call from a Napa Valley resident to ask for help with a baby pig her daughter had discovered in Solano County. The pig, now called Lucy, had been abandoned in a field by her mother and by the ranchers that "owned." her. She was one-week old and unable to fend for herself. Lucy was cared for by a good Samaritan until JARR could find a temporary foster home. Erica Rushing, at Flat Broke Farms, took her in and cared for her as a loved member of the

household until she was well enough to find a permanent home to live out her life. Rushing acclimatized Lucy to humans by teaching her tricks using Cheerio's as treats.

"My journey with Lucy has been an adventurous one. She came to our rescue a tiny little piglet, needed extra heat from a heat lamp, multiple feedings per day and a ton of positive training to ensure she survived and found a forever home!" said Erica Rushing, Founder and Director, Flat Broke Farms," She flops over for belly scratches now, has learned twirl, sit and "up" for easy transport. Lucy is on the threatened species list for 2016; the red wattle breed is nearing extinction so her life is extra important!

After, Lucy was put up for adoption on JARR's social media sites, renowned farmed animal rescue, Animal Place sanctuary offered to take Lucy in the hopes that she would become a companion for one of their lonely male pigs, Bert. Lucy's journey to a permanent safe home will see its final leg on Monday as the JARR team drives with her to Animal Place to meet her possible future love.

"Many know JARR for its tireless rescue of companion animals; we are fortunate also to rescue farmed animals and horses as well," said Monica Stevens, President and Co-Founder of JARR, "Lucy epitomizes the phrase, 'It Takes A Village;' from her actual rescue from abandonment and starvation at a ranch by a good Samaritan to her fostering to her final home at Animal Place and all the volunteers and love in between. A village of compassionate animal advocates has come to Lucy's aid and she now has the promise of a beautiful future."
