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Jameson Animal Rescue Ranch Purchases a Carneros Property to Build Domestic and Farmed Animal Rescue and Sanctuary

Napa, CA – Napa Valley based non-profit, Jameson Animal Rescue Ranch (JARR), has acquired a property located at 1199 Cuttings Wharf Rd, Napa to build a rescue and sanctuary campus for all domestic animals - horses, companion and farmed animals.

The new location will go through an approximate two-year build-out. The campus site has plans for a variety of programs including dog and cat adoption, a veterinary hospital, a welcome and educational center, a sanctuary and adoption area for farmed animals and horses and the campus will also serve as the organizations HQ for animal rescue and evacuation during a natural disaster.

Currently, JARR's Community Animal Assistance Program is dedicated to helping responsible pet owners keep their pets and to reduce the overpopulation of pets through a rigorous spay/neuter program. The "Ranch" will not only expand JARR's ability to save animals but will also be a hub of humane education to help alleviate animal cruelty, suffering, hunger and unwanted pets.

"Our vision to build a state of the art rescue and sanctuary for all domestic and farmed animals has been such a dream of ours for years that we are beyond thrilled it has finally become a reality," said JARR Co-Founder, Monica Stevens, "We could not have achieved this without the support and help from our amazing, compassionate community and donors."

The Cutting's Wharf property was made possible in part with the generous support of Dario Sattui and others. Several professionals from the real estate and development community in Napa were instrumental in making the vision a reality. As the planning for the build-out continues, volunteers have a unique opportunity to be involved from ground zero in making this dream become a reality.
